Specification:

The Free State Gambling, Liquor and Tourism Authority is hereby looking to recruit matriculants for Tourism related experiential training programme as part of the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP). The programme covers classroom and workplace training leading to the attainment of an accredited NQF 4 qualification, which capacitate candidates to be Tourism Safety Monitors. Learners will be placed in Tourism attraction sites across the province for experiential training.

Requirements are as follows:

- Priority will be given to those who have not participated in any EPWP/NDT funded tourism projects in the last two years,
